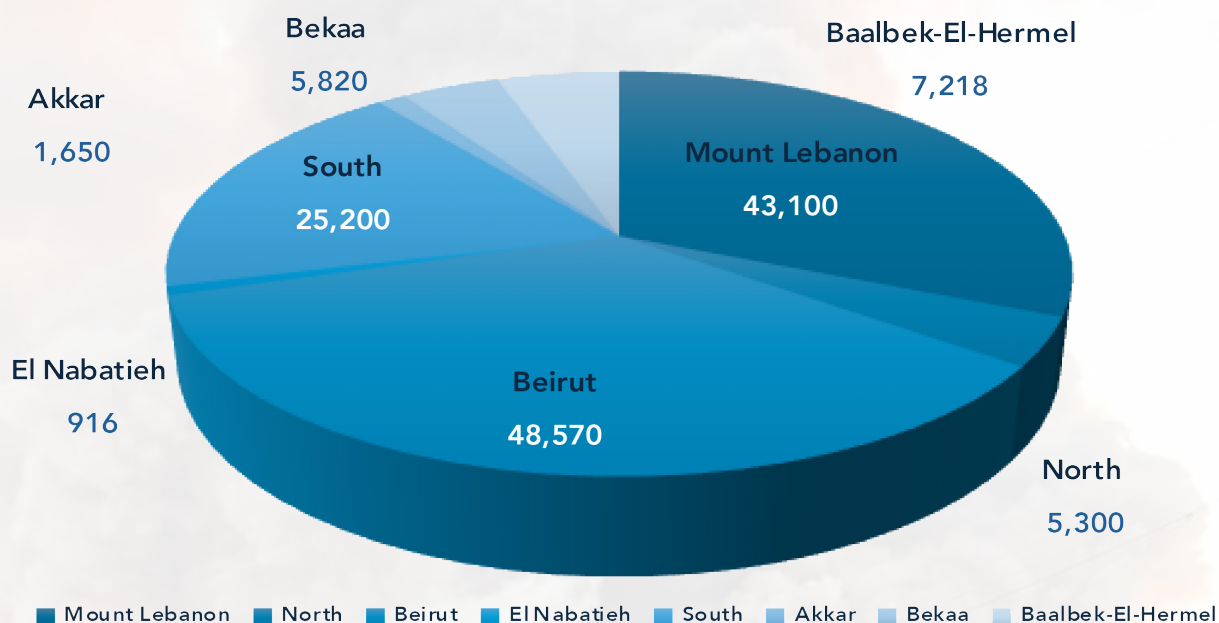

Over all situation

During a single month, more than 1.2 million people in Lebanon were displaced around 20% of the population.

The ongoing tension and fear caused by the conflict have been extremely exhausting, especially for families who had already been displaced due to previous crises. As of April 2026, Lebanon is facing a catastrophic “triple emergency” characterized by large-scale conflict-driven displacement, a severe economic collapse, and paralysis of state institutions. Damage to infrastructure resulting from the fighting has exceeded \$14 billion, and humanitarian needs are rapidly outpacing available funding.

Challenges

- According to DRM reports, approximately 47,700 children are currently accommodated in collective shelters, including 486 schools (364 public, 75 private, and 47 TVET) that host IDPs and therefore unavailable for learning, only a small proportion of children are accessing structured education
- An increase in food prices has been reported, mainly due to rising fuel and transportation costs, heightened demand linked to the escalation, and regional energy disruptions. A confirmed 17 per cent increase in the price of bread has also been observed. These rising costs are adding pressure on conflict-affected displaced individuals and affecting their ability to meet their basic daily food needs
- widespread displacement has led to at least 92 children under five and 146 pregnant and breastfeeding women defaulting from treatment and missing essential nutrition support due to insecurity and transportation barriers
- Increasing protection risks are reported across collective sites resulting from overcrowding, limited privacy, and limited capacities to respond to the complex concerns of vulnerable people

ISWA Work

Throughout the war, our efforts have *focused* on standing alongside displaced and vulnerable communities, responding to their most urgent needs with care, respect, and a strong sense of humanity. We have worked to provide **essential support** such as *food assistance, blankets, mattresses, pillows, hygiene supplies, hot meals, shelters renovation, and PSS activities, It also manages the Iman Shelter in Abra – Sidon, ensuring that families are able to maintain a minimum standard of living despite the extremely difficult conditions, ensuring that families can maintain a basic standard of living despite extremely challenging circumstances.*

Beyond material support, our work has been rooted in *maintaining dignity, offering a sense of stability, and reinforcing resilience within communities affected by displacement and loss*. We continue to adapt our response to the evolving situation, committed to providing compassionate, assistance to those who need it most.
